The Producing Artistic Director and Associate Artistic Director will be the only personnel reviewing your audition video submission.

PRODUCTION INFORMATION

Rehearsal Times: Weekday rehearsals (Tuesday through Friday) are typically 12pm-7pm, Saturdays and Sundays are 12pm-5pm. All rehearsal hours are subject to change.

Performance Times: Previews are Thursday and Friday at 6:30pm, and Saturday at 2pm. Regular performances are Wednesday at 12pm, Thursday at 2pm, Friday at 7pm, Saturday at 2pm and 7pm, and Sunday at 2pm.

COMPENSATION

Union (AEA): Currently To-Be-Negotiated (Previous for 2021: AEA SPT(-6), \$526.00/week)

Non-Union: \$375/week, +8 EMC weeks available.
